The USA team, of which Gerry is the Captain, took 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 6th places and was awarded the Gold Team Medal. Gerry has been a serious contender for a long time. Gerry is a director of the International Aerobatics Club and a past president of IAC Chapter One.
