While desirous of owning a business that pays it's way and eventually shows a return on investment, the new owners say that, like Art, they truly support general aviation and want to try to help keep it affordable. They also want to keep Galt Airport the kind of place where customers enjoy spending their leisure time.

Co-owner Michael Stanard will live in the old farm house. He plans to convert the existing indoor pool area into his studio and offices. Michael has been involved in many national ad campaigns. A current project is designing the new Lionel Trains catalog.

The new owners say they are approaching change with caution and no, they aren't going to "jack up your rent right away". In a recent chat with Michael, he said that the first order of business will be a general cleanup. Michael says, "We just want this to be the nicest little airport in the whole area".
