FAVORITE FLY-OUTS:

West Chicago - DuPage County (DPA)

**** Something Special! ** Probably won't hurt you
*** Worth the trip! * Pack plenty of barf bags

DuPage has it all. There's JA (avionics), a nice pilot shop, an upholstery shop, American Flyers, two FBOs and 24 hr. service, a museum - or maybe you'd just like to stick your head in the FSDO and say, "Hi!"

The airport's history goes back to 1928/29 when the land was bought and the first hangar built. During W.W.II it was a Navy training field and Howard Aircraft Co. (remember the "Howard 500") built and tested trainers and med-evac aircraft there.

The West Chicago (DuPage) beacon was the first fix on the old lighted airway from Midway to Minneapolis -- it now sits atop the silo at Galt where it still proudly serves. After the war, the airport became the DuPage County Airport. In the '60s the tower and Rwy 10/28 were built. In the '70s additional land to the south was acquired and in 1992 the north/south parallels were commissioned. Since then the flight center has opened to the public, the high tail hangar and new control tower have been built and a U.S. Customs office has opened allowing international arrivals.

If you're looking for a bite to eat, there's the Kitty Hawk Cafe (***) on the field, M-F 7:30-5 & Sun. brunch.. If you park at the NE corner of the airport you can walk across the street where there is a bar (**) that serves sandwiches.

Pheasant Run Lodge and Playhouse (****) is very close and you can call for a ride if you're attending a play and/or having a meal there (630/584-6300). There are several other good restaurants in the St. Charles /West Chicago area and all the fast food places are lined up along North Ave. (Rte. 64) between the airport and St. Charles.
