Watertown is a nice airport to visit; good facilities and a top notch FBO, Wisconsin Aviation. It's also a great place to stop for lunch or dinner or even to overnight. Clustered together on Hwy 26, just a short walk (a block or two west of the FBO) are a Holiday Express, Super Eight, a bank with an ATM, a Taco Bell, a Culvers, a (soon to open) Perkins and best of all, a grille & bar called Steakfire. Steakfire is the kind of place you take the people you really like. They're open seven days a week, 11am-10pm -- 9:30am on Sundays for Brunch. They have daily lunch specials (around \$6) and great sandwiches -- we had the tenderloin steak sandwich (\$6.25) and wow -- it was the sort of steak you'd expect for dinner! For dinner (after 5pm) they feature an interesting concept, grill your own steaks and seafood. You choose your entree from a refrigerated display case. There are cowboy size T-bones, strips, filets, etc., plus huge beef, chicken, shrimp or vegetarian shish kabobs. Any of the above for \$11.95. If you're not into "burn your own", they also have a full service menu.
