On average, the FAA receives 2000 airman medical certificate applications a day. Nine hundred seventy five, nearly 50%, are rejected for a deficiency, most likely a lack of documentation

As we get older, the chances of certification problems increase. If you are having or anticipate having a certification problem, it is best to have your 'ducks in a row' before you apply. First, read the EAA Aeromedical Advisory Report, P.104 in the Dec. '98 issue of *Sport Aviation*. Then, contact the EAA with your questions. Sunday Brunch at the American Club, Kohler, WI.

Here's a favorite fly-out to save for a very special occasion. If you like brunches with lots of excellent food, the best one in this hemisphere is only a scant hour away

by Cherokee or Skyhawk (35 min. by RV-6A). The Wisconsin Room at The American Club Hotel has a Sunday brunch from 10 AM to 2 PM. The variety and quality of food is excellent, from fresh squeezed orange juice (if you're not flying you can enjoy Champagne) and a buffet of salads, pastries, eggs, smoked salmon, fruit French toast, blintzes, etc... This is 'all you can eat'. Then you can select a regular entree (eggs Benedict, steak and eggs, omelets, and other potential weight and balance issues for the return flight. Oh yes, the flight. This is a low stress trip. Fly into Sheboygan County (SBM). On approach tell the FBO, Magnus Aviation, that you would like a ride to the American Club and they will have the complimentary van waiting for you for the ten minute ride (gratuities accepted). OK, so this sounds too good to be true -- here's the catch -- the all inclusive price is about \$24 per person. The other catch is that your wife or girlfriend will probably want to stay at the American (\$\$\$\$) Club sometime. Other things to do: there is a free museum/showroom of Kohler plumbing products (this could be expensive too, unless you *really* wanted to remodel your kitchen and bath). The top rated Black Wolf golf course is there also. Reservations are required for the brunch (800/344-2838). Magnus Aviation at SBM (920/467-6151) The American Club is **** + !

IS YOUR PROJECT INSURED?

If you are building or restoring an aircraft in your garage, basement or out building (or on someone else's premises) there is a good chance that your project is not insured. It doesn't take long to get thousands of dollars invested in a project and most homeowners policies would not cover this kind of loss should your project be damaged, destroyed or vandalized.

If your project is at home, check with your insurance agent. They may cover it on your homeowners policy at a small additional cost. If your project is at someone else's place, you should check to see if you are covered under their policy -- most likely not! In that case, you can insure it with someone like Avemco for about 1% of the value of the project per year.
