MAY 8 - YOUNG EAGLES FLIGHTS

The Young Eagles Program is proving to be a great success. EAA 932 will have monthly Young Eagles days on 2nd Saturdays, May -Oct. from 11 AM to 4 PM.

Young Eagles are given a certificate marking the event and are entered into the "world's largest logbook" at the EAA Airventure Museum in Oshkosh.

Written parental permission is required. Parental consent forms (*if needed in advance*) are available by calling Jack Hartery, EAA Chap. 932 Young Eagles Coordinator, at 815/243-5767 and leaving a message. There will be no rain dates. Parents/siblings may also ride on a "space available" basis. Former Young Eagles can ride again as long as it is with a different pilot in a different aircraft.

Refreshments will be available on Young Eagles days and serve as the primary fund raising activity for EAA Chapt. 932 during 1999.

If you would like to be a part of this worthwhile and "fun" activity, why not join us? Pilots need only be EAA members (don't have to belong to a local chapter), be "current" and have an airworthy aircraft with a minimum of \$100,000 liability insurance. EAA has an umbrella policy that covers you for an additional amount up to one million dollars while conducting Young Eagle flights.
