Election of President and Vice President

While no firm decisions were reached, it was agreed that the building should be planned and constructed for the eventual inclusion of running water, heat and toilet facilities.

Flight Standard Seminar

Michael Stanard announced that **Scott Landorf**, the Safety Program Manager at the Flight Standard District Office of the F.A.A. would like to hold a seminar at Galt Field and proposed that the Chapter help in the advertisement and preparation for it. There would be approximately two months lead-time required. **Larry Dagley** said this would be a good learning experience and moved that the Chapter support this effort. It was unanimously accepted.

Young Eagles

The remainder of the day was spent flying Young Eagles from two Boy Scout troops. Twenty Eight flights were flown by Scott, John, Larry and Don, while Ted manned the computer and churned out the certificates. The enthusiasm of the Scouts was evident even in the cold, sunny weather. Galt was hoping to fly the one millionth Young Eagle, but that honor went instead to another Illinois chapter that same afternoon.

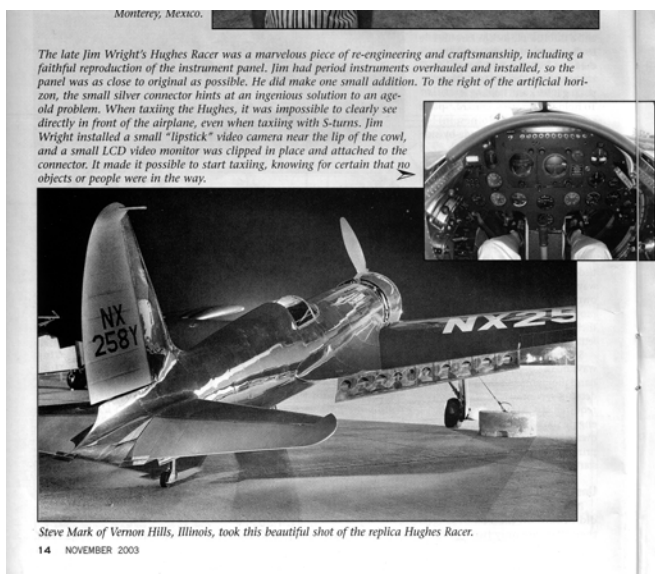


We flew 28 Young Eagles on the same day another Illinois Chapter had the honor of flying the 1,000,000th
