

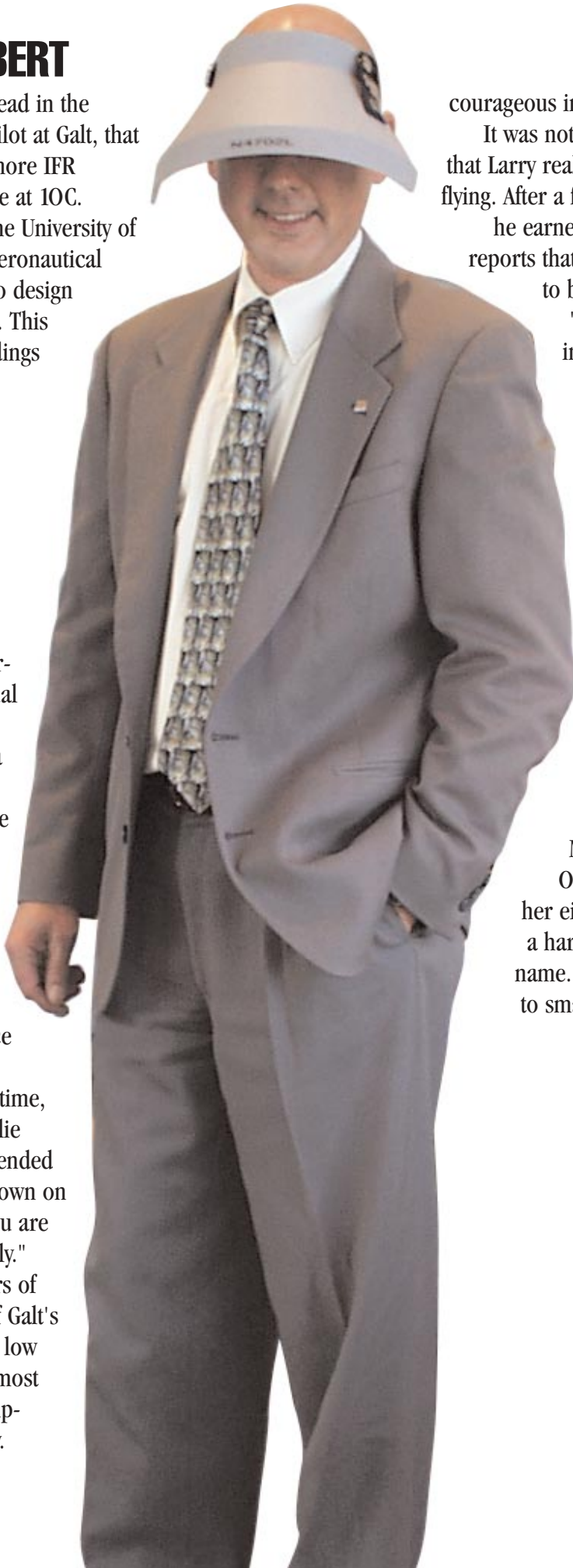
THIS GUY'S THE LIMIT™
